Thanks for the great pictures, **Lori**. I'm afraid the second chick didn't survive. 😞 It hatched out this morning, but we haven't really seen any motion since then, and it should have been up and about a bit by afternoon. Their third egg apparently failed in some fashion a few days before the first two hatched - the Carolina Raptor Center reported that the parents had removed it from the nest.

But the first egg hatched successfully and the chick is looking good! 😊 There are a lot of pics on the Hancock forum - link to the thread is [here](#). (We've provisionally nicknamed her Olympia, in recognition of the Olympics, until CRC announces her official name - so I may call her that here on occasion.)

Added: Hi **laurad**! It's either on or almost on the ground, but is insulated to protect the eggs. The eagles were given their choice of nesting places, and this is the one they chose.

Another interesting thing is that they share their enclosure with 5 other non-releasable eagles - who apparently know enough to stay away from their nest. 😊

I believe both Derek and Savannah fly enough to get to the platform you see beyond the nest, and I think it could have been used as a nesting location. My recollection is that several possible nest areas were offered, and they chose the one on the ground. The reason it's insulated is that they lost their eggs during a cold spell last year, so insulation was added over the summer to accommodate the cooler temperatures the south seems to be experiencing lately.

I read about their previous chicks (they had two in 2006 and one in 2008), and I think they're removed from the nest to hacking towers at about the same 5-6 weeks of age as the chicks at Pigeon Forge. There are not a lot of breeding pairs in North Carolina, so CRC is proud to be able to contribute to that effort. They have a nice video talking about their work on their facebook page - <http://www.facebook.com/CarolinaRaptorCenter>. I don't think you need to be a member of facebook to view it.

I'm not sure I completely believe it, but eagles don't have calendars, so they may

assume the eaglet fledged. I don't know about the CRC, but the AEF removes chicks when they are old enough to feed themselves and young enough to not see over the edge of the nest and realize that there are people around. 5-6 weeks is when the parents start spending a lot less time at the nest (mostly stopping by drop off food), so I'm not sure that the experience is as different for hacked eaglets as it seems.

That said, I also feel sad when they remove the little ones. 😞

This certainly is a different perspective than we're used to seeing - but they've successfully raised three chicks - 2 in 2006 and 1 in 2008. I can't remember what happened in 2007 - but in 2009 they lost their eggs, probably during some unusually cold weather. (The nest box was insulated a bit this year to protect it now that North Carolina gets snow.) I haven't heard that the presence of other eagles has been a problem - and as we know, all eagles must defend their territory - Derek and Savannah's territory is just a bit smaller than what we're used to seeing.

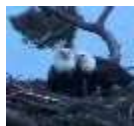

Very few pictures of Noah today - she seemed to spend most of the day hiding in the shadows - or the places where the cam wasn't looking. It did seem very sunny, so may have been quite warm. Most of the pics are of from today's site visit - more interaction between Noah and the person/people who check on her than I've seen before. Noah is eight weeks old today - perhaps they do a bit more of a checkup once a week or every couple of weeks. I think I got s'caps of every refresh, but of course don't know what happened in the five seconds between s'caps.

There's a point when Noah looks very aggressive - and I'm wondering if the visitor was removing what was left of her food from the day before (perhaps to measure/weigh it?). He was in the area where I thought her pile of what looked like fish heads were, and he had something in his hand. Whatever was going on - I don't think Noah liked it!



This is also the first day I've seen the flap in the wall used, though I'm guessing it has been used before because Noah seems interested in it.

There are a few new comments from the folks at the Carolina Raptor Center on their Facebook page (<http://www.facebook.com/CarolinaRaptorCenter>) - the one I found interesting is that Noah's diet consists mostly of fish and other natural foods like rats and squirrels. They also responded to a concern about the leaves in her pool by saying there would be leaves in the water she encountered in the wild, so that shouldn't bother her. I wish they'd tell us more about what's going on - but I do like their tone when they post.

The researcher who put the tracking device on the bird was out of town last week so we don't have any data from that device.

It is orphan season so the rehab staff is inundated with baby raptors they have over 70 right now and counting. These little guys require constant care and must be feed 3 times a day.

This is what I know as a volunteer and photographer for CRC. Please be patient with the staff as they are way under-staffed for the workload they are presented with right now.

I found Sean's post very encouraging - it means that Noah is spending time in the area around the tower (which I do feel is safer than hanging out at WalMart or even at someone's farm), and they are still providing food (I wasn't sure, where they said

they didn't expect her to return to the tower - but it's also possible the food is left at various locations on the ground near the tower rather than in the tower) - and there are good reasons why there's no tracking data yet (they're very busy, and the person who would provide the data is away).

I'd love to see a picture of Noah soaring (though with most cams it would sort of look like a black dot 😞) - but knowing she was seen by volunteers who are likely to be able to recognize her is almost as good. 😊

She's apparently in an underdeveloped area of Virginia, where cell phone reception is spotty at best (apparently her transmitter uses cell towers rather than satellites to send data back to the tracking site). I don't know how her transmitter works, but I do know that a lot of them save their data and transmit it once a day or twice a week or however it's been programmed. Not knowing the details, this is pure guesswork - but if you were in an area where cell phones only work if you're on top of a hill with no big trees between you and the horizon, and you could only call for five minutes every other day - if you didn't know the rules, the odds of your being in the right sort of place at the right five minutes is pretty slim.

From what I've read, that's where Noah is. And while she's a very smart young eaglet, I doubt that anyone explained the rules.

I am hoping that she gets tired of being that far into the wilderness, and shows up in an area with more cell phone towers - and I know that may not happen soon - or ever - but my money is on Noah. She's a strong - and adaptable - young eagle. 😊
